#### REPORT FROM THE CHAIRPERSON

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### 1. HEALTH AND SAFETY RECOGNITION PROGRAM

The Health and Safety Recognition Program honors those individuals, businesses, or groups who have demonstrated leadership in the field of health and safety issues or made a contribution to the mission of the Health and Safety Commission. Commissioner Demeter nominated the Pets Offering Ongoing Care and Healing Program (POOCH) program. Dogs and their owners in the POOCH Program provide a wide range of services throughout Cedars-Sinai Hospital. Dogs offer heartwarming and supportive experiences to patients and their family members. Director of Volunteer Services Barbara Leanse along with volunteers Mark and Max Friedman attended the meeting to accept the award.

The activities of POOCH volunteers include:

- Gentle play
- Walking with patients
- Visiting patients to provide emotional support
- Visiting family members in the surgical lobby
- · Letting patients brush and pet the dog
- Representing Cedars-Sinai in community outreach activities

#### 2. WATER CONSERVATION

Public Works Commissioner Jeff Wolfe attended to speak on water conservation issues. Commissioners asked questions regarding current water meters, obtaining help with how to minimize water usage in homes, and status of re-landscaping incentives.

#### 3. UPDATE ON DISABLED PLACARDS

At the request of Vice Chair Schwartz, Traffic and Parking Commissioner Jeffrey S. Levine attended to speak on the abuse of disabled placards in the City. Commissioner Demeter stated disabled placard abuse not only occurs in the business triangle, but residential areas as well. Parking Services Manager Russell Platamone attended to answer questions on regulation and enforcement of placard use. Mr. Platamone stated the process to regulate abusers was complicated, ongoing and challenging. He stated that the State is coming up with alternatives to reduce the problem. Mr. Levine stated that the City would like to build a grass roots effort with the disabled community in support of placard reform. Vice Chair Schwartz reminded everyone including the community and public that it is illegal to ask someone if they are disabled.

# 7. 2015 BIENNIAL CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE REPORT – HEALTH AND SAFETY COMMISSION

The 2015 Biennial Conflict of Interest Code was given to Commissioners for review and comments or changes. The Commission reviewed with no changes or amendments made.
