NEW BUSINESS

1. Health and Safety Recognition Program

For the month of July, Commissioner Myra Lurie nominated Fred Zaidman, Michael Blumenfeld, and Jeff Horn of the Cedars-Sinai Blood Donor Program for their extensive donation histories.

2. Health and Safety Observances

The Health and Safety Observances for each month will provide information on groups and organizations to raise awareness of an issue or commemorate a group or event.

For the month of July, information on sun safety was provided.

3. Fire Safety

Battalion Chief Scott Stephens provided information on Pet Alert decals that are being distributed to pet owners. Stickers can be displayed in the front window of homes or any common home entry point. These decals provide notification that pets are in the house. Firefighters will be trained to look for these decals in the event of an emergency.

4. National Night Out

The City of Beverly Hills' Fifth Annual National Night Out (NNO) Celebration will take place on Tuesday, August 2, 2016 from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 pm. The event will be held on Rexford Drive in front of the Library and the Fire Department.

Meena Janmohamed, Office of Emergency Management (OEM) interns, provided information on the three booths: OEM, Health & Safety Commission, & CERT.

Commissioners were asked to share ideas, provide suggestions regarding the booths, and staff the Health & Safety booth.

5. **Dangerstoppers**

The Dangerstoppers episode "Fight the Bite" was presented for the Commission.

Pamela Mottice-Muller, Director Office of Emergency Management, encouraged the community to take the proper precautions for prevention with diseases that are transferred by mosquitos.

An article from the July 21, 2016 Park Labrea News/Beverly Press newspaper regarding tiger mosquitos was distributed.

6. *Disaster Ready:* Beverly Hills Disaster Preparedness Certification for Businesses Program

Meena Janmohamed provided a report on the Office of Emergency Management's ongoing efforts to mitigate against disasters and educate residents, employees, and the business community. OEM has launched Disaster Ready, a formal recognition of businesses engaging in disaster planning efforts to foster a culture of emergency preparedness in the business community.

This report provided an overview of the Disaster Ready requirements, activities, associated benefits, and potential branding and marketing opportunities. Commissioners were asked to review and provide feedback.

7. Meningococcal Disease

Meena Janmohamed provided information on the L.A. County Department of Public Health (DPH) public relations toolkit to spread awareness of the recent outbreak of meningococcal disease. Meningococcal disease is a rare, but serious disease that can lead to swelling in the brain and spinal cord, loss of a limb, deafness, brain damage, or even death. Recent LA County data shows more cases than usual among gay men/men who have sex with men (MSM).
