REPORTS FROM PRIORITY AGENCIES

2. Proposed Water Rate Structure

Director of Public Works Shana Epstein updated the Commission on the proposed 5-year water rate increases for infrastructure investments. If approved, the plan will be effective January 1, 2018.

3. Beverly Hills Ambassador Program

Human Relations Administrator, James R. Latta and Ambassador Program Operations Manager, Kris Zagyva updated the Commission on the City's 2-year old Ambassador Program that works throughout the business district and the recent assignment to the School District sites, provided statistics of the program, and answered the Commission's questions.

Commissioner Bilak requested her comment recommending the use of Ambassadors to patrol La Cienega and Roxbury Parks after hours be added to the minutes.

CONTINUED BUSINESS

4. Robertson Boulevard Ficus Tree Removal and Replacement

For the past several years, several business owners have expressed an interest in the replacement of Ficus trees as part of a revitalization project for Robertson Boulevard. In addition, roots from the Ficus trees continue to damage City infrastructure, necessitating frequent repair projects. Urban Forest Manager Ken Pfalzgraf provided the Commission with a summary of process over the past three years and an update on current conditions regarding the Robertson Boulevard Ficus trees.

<u>Public Comment</u>: The following spoke regarding their support of the replacement of Ficus trees on Robertson Boulevard: Melanie Rosenthal, Larry Paletz, Benjamin Yadegar and Julie Trantham.

Speakers noted profuse litter, sidewalk damage, aesthetics and tree proportions as reasons to replace the Ficus trees. It was suggested that the City provide relief by improving the trim cycle frequently to annually until a permanent solution can be implemented.

Mr. Pfalzgraf will provide a summary letter of the Robertson Boulevard Ficus discussion for the November Recreation and Parks Commission Meeting packet and also noted that he will be calendaring several other discussions with the Commission in the upcoming months on street tree issues including the 100-400 blocks of North Elm Drive and the 100 block of El Camino Drive and Cinthia Drive.

Motion by ROSTON, Seconded by ROSOFF that Ken Pfalzgraf have the ability to replace vacancies with trees using the model in front of Horace Mann School (alternating Mexican Fan Palms and Crape Myrtle trees) and that the recommendation be placed on a City Council Study Session. (5/0)

5. Greystone Demonstration Garden

The Commission returned from a Special Recreation and Parks Meeting that was held on October 24, 2017 from 12:30 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. at Greystone Mansion Demonstration Garden where they were joined by garden founder Barbara Linder for a tour of the area.

The Commission thanked Ms. Linder for the work, time and the classes she has been providing and requested staff to submit a price for the recommended security gate to be installed. A survey of the entire lower property is also requested for long-term plans and items associated with plan can be prioritized.

Public Comment: Vice Commissioner Ilona Sherman of the Design Review Commission spoke highly of Barbara Linder's Greystone Demonstration Garden and requested promotion and an outreach program for the garden.

STATUS REPORTS

- 6. Capital Improvement Projects Update Director of Community Services Nancy Hunt-Coffey update the Commission on the following:
 - Greystone: Project repairs continue on at Greystone; bids have been finalized to paint the historic bathroom; one proposal has been submitted and waiting for an additional one for the restoration of the library project; the contract is in place to continue the wood restoration; the door hardware project is complete; waterproofing has started; Friends Of Greystone (FOG) are working on a Donor Recognition system.; items in the ladies lounge are being restored. The theatre is currently on hold.
 - Beverly Gardens Part Restoration: Phase 1: is coming to a close with the cactus garden being completed. Save The Date for the Mayor's Walk on Monday, December 11, 2017 for a preview of the Cactus Garden. Phase 2: (art block) under construction; some upgrades to the Lily Pond; scheduled for completion by early January 2018. Restroom will be completed early December. Scheduled to bring Phase 3 to the City Council in December. Prior to that, the project will be reviewed by the Cultural Heritage Commission (CHC) in addition to the Public Works Commission.
 - Coldwater Park and Playground Renovation: The Recreation and Parks Commission unanimously approved the proposed conceptual design plans as presented at their September 26, 2017 Commission Meeting. The same plan was presented to the City Council at their October 27, 2017 Study Session. Council provided direction to proceed to construction designs. Intent is to begin construction in early 2018 and conclude by late Spring/early Summer 2018.
 - La Cienega Community Center: HVAC is completed. Picnic tables are requested to be placed with the Parks standardized tables.
 - La Cienega Tennis Center Court Resurfacing Project: Completed. The Tennis Pro Shop/Tennis Lessons contract expires March 31, 2018 so Request For Proposals (RFP) will be sent out towards the end of the month.

8 Director's Report

Assistant Director of Community Services Pam Shinault introduced Kristin Buhagiar, the City's new Recreation Services Manager.

Staff was directed to return with scope options for the Fine Art Commission; including a subcommittee. The Cultural Plan lays out a framework.
