An application form for appointment to the Traffic and Parking Commission may be obtained in the City Clerk's office in Room 290 of City Hall or by calling 310.285.2400. It is recommended that those seeking appointment attend Traffic and Parking Commission meetings to familiarize themselves with current issues and how the meetings are conducted.

When there is a vacancy, the City Council announces the upcoming vacancy and invites interested persons to submit application forms. The City Council and the Traffic and Parking Commission Liaison Committee then schedule candidates for an informal interview. The subcommittee recommendation is made to the City Council, and the City Council appoints the successful candidate at a formal public meeting. The City Clerk swears in new Traffic and Parking Commissioners sometime before their first meeting, generally immediately prior to their first meeting.

I have been to the METRO meetings for over one year. I attend the Complete Streets meetings, participated in their walk audit, and, on Earth Day 2019, I worked the Complete Streets booth at the B.H. Farmer's Market with City Staff answering questions and handing out information. I have done outreach to residents and businesses on a variety traffic and parking issues.

3. Have you attended one or more full Traffic and Parking Commission meeting(s) within the last 12 months? Why did you attend these particular meetings? Please comment on your reactions:

I have attended almost all the TPC meetings for the last three years. I started attending them as a Health & Safety Commissioner as I realized the inherent overlap. It was during this time that I realized how much I enjoyed working on these critical issues and I continued to attend these meetings, giving me a historical perspective on the TPC's work.

4. TPC meetings are held in the morning, with occasional evening or weekend special meetings. How much time do you envision giving to the Traffic and Parking Commission? How often are you out of town? What other commitments might cause conflicts in your scheduling of Commission meetings or other related activities?

I have no problems attending morning or evening meetings or working on the weekends. I am happy to volunteer for any work that is needed, as I do not have any other commitments.

5. What do you see as the major **traffic** issues currently facing Beverly Hills?

a) Distracted driving and distracted pedestrians- strong need to educate drivers and pedestrians not to be distracted while driving and walking.

b) Educating and Re-educating - since our streets have largely been empty in the last three months, there is a need to re-educate the public about illegal J-walking, U-turns, speeding, and pedestrians' walking in bicycle lanes.

c) Traffic and safety improvements at Beverly Vista and surrounding streets, as well as pedestrian awareness.

6. What do you see as the major **parking** issues currently facing Beverly Hills?

a) Disabled Placard Misuse - use by caregivers and drivers utilizing permit only parking spots on residential streets where they park all day with a Disabled Placard.

b) Permit parking on residential streets: not enough spaces for renters; homeowners selling their permits; workers, friends and family cannot get close to homes they are trying to visit because people working on South Beverly Drive are using those spaces.

c) Parking revenue decline from lockdown - \$834,000 lost revenue in March and April.


7. Why do you wish to be a member of the Traffic and Parking Commission? (Specifically, why have you chosen this form of community service over the many other avenues of community service available in our community?)

2. Please describe any technical expertise (engineering, planning, knowledge of regional transportation issues or regulations or other background information [education, business or personal]) that you feel might be useful to you as a Traffic and Parking Commissioner:

I have an MBA from the Anderson School at UCLA with a concentration in Finance and Accounting - this is an essential foundation for understanding the issues facing our City - the best solutions to traffic and parking issues require a balance between what is wanted by different constituencies, what makes the most sense for our City and all its residents, and what works economically - a TPC Commissioner must be able to effectively interact with staff the the City Council and provide staff with proper direction to get real answers to aid in decision making and policy recommendations to the City Council. I have spent the last 30+ years building Rock Asset Management as a commercial real estate company - during that time I have dealt with many parking and traffic issues related to the properties we own - my track record speaks to a professional who listens very well and consistently comes up with creative solutions to solve problems. Specifically with regard to TPC, I worked with the City Council and Barry Brucker and Willie Brien to implement the traffic diversion system currently in place on Sunset Blvd. at Roxbury, Bedford and Crescent - I am very proud of the result we achieved, which had a dramatic impact on improving traffic flow and safety in our residential neighborhoods. Lastly, I am a very good listener, I ask good questions, am not afraid to say that I do not understand something, I am respectful of differing opinions, I have a stellar reputation for honesty and treating others with dignity and respect - these are essential in dealing with members of our community with diverse views on issues. As you will see below, I am also very good at observing things on a daily basis that impact the quality of life in BH, and a good number of these are traffic and parking related.

3. Have you attended one or more full Traffic and Parking Commission meeting(s) within the last 12 months? Why did you attend these particular meetings? Please comment on your reactions:

Yes - to give the TPC an update on the traffic diversion on Sunset Blvd. at Roxbury, Bedford and Crescent - specifically, there needed to be more delineaters added to make it clearer to drivers that they cannot go across Sunset at these intersections - I succeeded in having one delineater added to each intersection - it is not enough, but it was a step in the right direction. I also attended another meeting to inform the TPC of the parking violation appeal process and how it was not up to the level that Beverly Hills residents are entitled to expect - that was the result of a parking citation I received where the signage restricting parking was woefully inadequate - note - I got the citation revoked and new signage was added.

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My kids are all grown, my business and home are in BH, I do not travel a lot for business and the only other commitments I have relate to AYSO - so I do not see any real issues on conflicts.

5. What do you see as the major traffic issues currently facing Beverly Hills?

Traffic and parking issues impact us all - residents and visitors - on a daily basis - that is why I am passionate about serving on the TPC. As far as issues go, where do I begin? Some are large, like the flow of traffic through our residential neighborhoods, where streets are used as "cut through" routes thanks to Wayz and other apps, bike lanes for sure need some attention, as well as general biking law education and enforcement (eg the danger of running through stop signs routinely) and lastly the enforcement of our speeding, reckless driving and DUI laws in the most effective and cost efficient manner. I would also add traffic mitigation measures like no parking zones on some streets during commuting and rush hour times.

6. What do you see as the major parking issues currently facing Beverly Hills?

Again, there are a myriad of issues, each important to some portion of our City. Some are quite large, like what happens to the 2-hour free parking provision in the wake of Covid-19 driven financial challenges, what do we do with the cost of metered parking going forward, or the creation of more preferred parking districts, and my all time favorite (which is really more of a State issue), the abuse of Disabled Person placards. On a bit smaller scale, I want to have the City consider adopting a provision that limits construction worker parking in front of neighboring properties when residential construction goes on at a home for months and years, and we also need to look at the food trucks (aka Roach Coaches) that park on Lexington every day, creating a virtual restaurant in violation of our City rules - do we want these trucks to be allowed to simply set up a restaurant wherever they want, and if so, shouldn't they be required to have the same City of BH business license, insurance, etc. as other businesses? I have a constantly updated list of issues related to parking and traffic in our city that I create through my daily observations and experiences.

There are many things I care about greatly in our city, but I am most passionate about traffic and parking because these are things that affect all of us, residents, businesses, visitors and tourists alike, every single day.. That means that the TPC can have a very meaningful impact on the quality of life for everyone in BH and that is something that I am really drawn to and want to be a part of.
