

# BEVERLY HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT EXECUTIVE SUMMARY APRIL 2021

#### **Crime Summary:**

During April 2021, we saw a +12% increase in overall crime compared to March 2021. The largest contributing factors were an increase in Commercial Burglaries and Motor Vehicle Thefts. Overall, total crime still remains down at -5% year-to-date. We have had 66 less crimes committed thus far in 2021. Our response time to Emergency Calls for Service was 3.23 minutes and we received 2,856 Community Generated Calls for Service during April 2021.

#### **Detective Bureau:**

- During April 2021, we continued to work on the II Pastaio Robbery and shooting case

  Detectives and Crime Impact Team personnel led a coordinated effort to investigate and solve several residential burglaries committed by a group of foreign national suspects. Three suspects were arrested in early April and all cases were filed by the L.A. County District Attorney's Office Detectives, SWAT and Crime Impact Team personnel served search warrants at two separate locations in regards to an attempted murder, torture and assault with a deadly weapon case that occurred during March 2021 at a residence in the north end of the City. Two arrests were made and all of the abovementioned felony charges were filed by the L.A. County District Attorney's Office

  The Detective Bureau was placed on Tactical alert for several days in late April following the

### **Geographical Policing:**

- Geographical Policing Officers have been collaborating with the business community on crime reduction strategies including our 3SI global positioning merchandise trackers
- Geographical Policing Officers continue to collaborate with our security teams (NASTEC & Covered-6) to help support BHPD with high visibility patrols

#### **Traffic Division:**

- During April 2021, our Traffic Bureau focused on Distracted Driving Enforcement which led to a +76% (+56) increase in speed violation citations
- We issued 10,755 parking citations
- We saw a +100% (+8) increase in Hit & Run accidents





Crime Category	Sub-Category	Description
ASSAULT	Assault – Aggravated	An assault with a weapon or with the intent to inflict severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assault – Simple	An assault with no intent and not resulting in severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assaults – Prior to Sept 2018	All aggravated and simple assaults (previously combined).
BURGLARY	Burglary – Commercial Building	Entry into a commercial business after business hours with the intent to commit theft
	Burglary – Construction Site	Any entry onto a construction site with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Accessed Garage Only)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a garage (subterranean, attached to residence, detached from residence) with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Home Occupied)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony while the residence is occupied at the time of the crime.
	Burglary – Residential (Common Area)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a common mail area or laundry room of a multi-family residence with the intent to commit mail theft or coin theft.
	Burglary – Residential (No One Home)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony when no one is home at the time of the crime.
DUI ARREST		The arrest of a person for driving while under the influence of any alcoholic beverage or drug.
HOMICIDE		The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT	Motor Vehicle Theft	The theft of a motor vehicle.
ROBBERY	Shoplift Robbery	A shoplifter uses force against store security to retain property stolen from the location.
