**1) PUBLIC COMMENT**

Members of the public will be given the opportunity to directly address the Committee on any item listed on the agenda.

**2) 2016 Accomplishments**

Chair Nazarian gave a brief overview of the Commission's 2016 accomplishments. Both Councilmembers Bosse and Gold were in agreement that the Commission had accomplished a good workload in 2016 and looked forward to the 2017 year.

**3) 2017 Work Plan**

- Chair Nazarian presented the Commission's 2017 focus of Cybersecurity. The Commission will hear monthly presentations on Cybersecurity related topics such as safe website identification, internet safety for children and teens, advancements in technology, email hoaxes, and fiber optics.
  - Councilmember Gold is interested in getting residents engaged in the topic of Cybersecurity. Councilmember Bosse agrees and suggests creating educational programs on the topic that provide information to seniors and children.
  - In order to create community awareness of this topic, Councilmember Bosse suggests that the Commission bring to Council a public recommendation on Cybersecurity.
- The Commission has created a Disaster Ready Program that will promote disaster preparedness efforts within the business community. Each month, the Commission will recognize those businesses that have submitted their application to become Disaster Ready partners.
- The Commission will continue their monthly Health and Safety Recognition Program. This Program honors individuals, businesses, or groups who have demonstrated leadership in the field of health and safety issues or have contributed to the mission of the Health and Safety Commission.
- The Commission will continue their work on providing the City Council with a recommendation on smoking in multi-unit housing.

- Councilmembers Bosse and Gold are interested in the Commission's recommendations for plans that take a broader vision on the smoking topic, such as extending the horizon to 5-10 years from now and creating stages that get the City further along a smoke-free path.
- Councilmember Bosse wants to emphasize an educational outreach component to the City's smoking ordinance so that both residents and visitors are aware of the City's smoking rules. The educational outreach plan should be ready to go into effect when the smoking ordinance is passed at the next City Council meeting in May.
- Councilmember Gold suggests researching nicotine replacement therapy medications to partner with the City's efforts towards becoming smoke-free.
