

BEVERLY HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT EXECUTIVE SUMMARY August 2022

Crime Summary

In August 2022, we saw a **16%** decrease in overall crime¹ compared to July 2022. Overall total crime is marginally up by **9%** year-to-date. We have had seventy-six more crimes committed thus far in 2022. Our response time to emergency calls for service is 2.52 minutes, and we received 3,643 community-generated calls for service.

Community Engagement

- This year's National Night Out (NNO) had a record number of visitors, estimated at over a thousand people. Chief Mark G. Stainbrook commended the Community Relations Unit (CRU) for coordinating the most successful NNO the community has ever attended. This year's NNO included numerous City departments, commissions, and local businesses in attendance. Additionally, we had our federal law enforcement partners (the United States Marshals Service and the United States Drug Enforcement Administration) join the festivities.
- CRU in coordination with the Joint Regional Intelligence Center, conducted ten security assessments, which included three residences, three City facilities, and four BHUSD schools.
- CRU facilitated three Neighborhood Watch meetings for Beats 5, 6, and 9, each with more than 20 participants. Beat 9's meeting had over 50 participants.
- CRU organized an Active Shooter Training with 30 participants at a major tech company in a multi-story building.

Detective Bureau

- In April of 2022, a victim was assaulted and robbed of his watch, wallet, and phone by three suspects. After the robbery, the three suspects fled to an awaiting vehicle which was driven by a fourth suspect. Detectives were able to identify the suspect's vehicle and the location of travel after the crime. The vehicle was later located outside of Beverly Hills, where the fourth suspect was identified. All four suspects were arrested. In August, the arrest resulted in a successful filing and prison terms for all suspects.
- From June through late August, several commercial thefts were committed by a male suspect at various retail stores in Beverly Hills. The suspect targeted high-end retail stores for handbags and purses. During the investigation, it was determined the suspect used vehicles rented by fraudulent means and Detectives were able to use this information to locate the suspect. A search warrant was done which resulted in the recovery of clothing worn by the suspect and numerous items of stolen property. The suspect was charged with several counts of Grand Theft for the crimes committed in Beverly Hills.

Traffic Division

The Traffic Bureau increased enforcement in the business district during the evening hours in regards to an ongoing loud exhaust & speed complaints.

- The Traffic Bureau Supervision provided a report to the Beverly Hills Traffic and Parking Commission.
- The Traffic Bureau implemented a speed deterrent corridor on Sunset Boulevard and Maple Drive.
- Major Collision Response Team (CRT) was deployed to a major traffic collision in the area of Doheny Drive and Clifton Way.
- The Traffic Bureau hosted and instructed a Standard Field Sobriety Test (SFST) Course for Beverly Hills' officers and six (6) outside agencies.





Crime Category	Sub-Category	Description
ASSAULT	Assault – Aggravated	An assault with a weapon or with the intent to inflict severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assault – Simple	An assault with no intent and not resulting in severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assaults – Prior to Sept 2018	All aggravated and simple assaults (previously combined).
BURGLARY	Burglary – Commercial Building	Entry into a commercial business after business hours with the intent to commit theft
	Burglary – Construction Site	Any entry onto a construction site with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Accessed Garage Only)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a garage (subterranean, attached to residence, detached from residence) with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Home Occupied)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony while the residence is occupied at the time of the crime.
	Burglary – Residential (Common Area)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a common mail area or laundry room of a multi-family residence with the intent to commit mail theft or coin theft.
	Burglary – Residential (No One Home)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony when no one is home at the time of the crime.
DUI ARREST		The arrest of a person for driving while under the influence of any alcoholic beverage or drug.
HOMICIDE		The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT	Motor Vehicle Theft	The theft of a motor vehicle.
ROBBERY	Shoplift Robbery	A shoplifter uses force against store security to retain property stolen from the location.
	Robbery	The taking of anything of value from a person by force or threat of force or violence.
SEX CRIMES		Includes rape, sexual battery and sex registrant violations.
THEFT/LARCENY	Theft – Grand	Theft where the value of the property exceeds \$950, or is taken from a person, or a firearm of any value.
	Theft – Petty	Theft where the value of the property is less than \$950.
	Theft From Commercial Building	Theft (regardless of value) from a commercial business, building or office.
	Theft of Auto Parts	Theft, limited to auto parts, from the interior or exterior of a vehicle.
VANDALISM		The malicious destruction, damage or defacing (graffiti) of real or personal property of another.
VEHICLE BREAK- IN/THEFT	Theft – Grand (From Vehicle)	Entry into a motor vehicle, without force, where the property stolen exceeds \$950.
	Theft – Petty (From Vehicle)	Entry into a motor vehicle, without force, where the property stolen is less than \$950.
	Burglary – From a Motor Vehicle	Forced entry into a locked motor vehicle with the intent to commit theft.
