Outdoor Watering Guidelines

On May 16, 2023, Beverly Hills City Council supported maintaining the previously adopted drought measures. This is a reminder that water efficiency measures are in place. These measures include:

- Two watering days a week during the summer months.
- No watering between 9am-6pm.
- Don't irrigate after measurable rainfall.
- Don't allow excessive water runoff due to sprinkler overspray or malfunctions.
- Repair leaks immediately.

Toilet Leaks

Old or worn-out toilet flappers (e.g., valve seal) can cause leaks. This simple rubber device holds water in the tank and then releases water into the bowl when the toilet is flushed. Because the rubber can wear out, the flapper should be checked periodically and replaced at least every five years to ensure a good seal and avoid leaks. An old or worn flapper can cause your toilet to flush on its own or silently leak thousands of gallons a year. Replacing a flapper is a quick and easy fix that will save water and money.
