A Free Community Screening of ‘*Beverly Hills: 100 Years, 100 Stories*’

*Back by popular demand, the documentary will screen at the
Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences on Sept. 14*

Beverly Hills, CA – The City of Beverly Hills and the Beverly Hills Historical Society is holding a free screening of *Beverly Hills: 100 Years, 100 Stories*. Discover how Beverly Hills became the most famous small city in the world! This engaging documentary—starring your friends and neighbors—will screen Thurs., Sept. 14 at 7:30 p.m. in the Samuel Goldwyn Theater at the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.

Directed and produced by Phil Savenick of the Beverly Hills Historical Society, *Beverly Hills: 100 Years, 100 Stories* provides an eyewitness account of our City’s legendary past. From the Rancho Days to the 21st Century, Beverly Hills’ vibrant history comes alive through interviews with more than 150 Beverly Hills residents and hundreds of rare photographs and film clips.

The documentary is back by popular demand following its successful January 2015 premiere at the Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts. The 500 seats for that screening were quickly reserved, with several hundred people placed on a waiting list.

Ticket-holders will be seated on a first come, first served basis after theater doors open at 6:30 p.m. Please join us for a reception immediately following the show.

Starting at 6:30 p.m., free parking is available in the parking structures at 8920 Wilshire Boulevard (south side of Wilshire, entrance on La Peer Drive) and 9025 Wilshire Boulevard (north side of Wilshire, entrance on Wetherly Drive). Both parking structures will be closed and locked 30 minutes after the event ends. Please note that residential parking permit requirements are strictly enforced on the side streets and City ordinance prohibits parking in alleys.

This free community screening is possible thanks to the generosity of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, which allows the City of Beverly Hills to use the theater at little or no cost for three events each year.
