

# BEVERLY HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT EXECUTIVE SUMMARY JULY 2021

#### **Crime Summary:**

During July 2021, we saw a 13% decrease in overall crime compared to June 2021. Overall, total crime continues to trend down at -9% year-to-date. We have had 124 less crimes committed thus far in 2021. Our response time to Emergency Calls for Service was lowered to 2.01 minutes and we received 3,074 Community Generated Calls for Service during July 2021.

#### **Significant Accomplishments:**

- Residential Burglaries were down (-7)
- Robberies were down (-4)
- Overall violent arrests are up 71% (+46). This is led by Robbery and Aggravated Assaults arrests at 107% (+31) and 47% (+16) respectively.

#### **Community Engagement:**

A "Just in Case" ZOOM meeting for the southeast portion (Zone 7) was held on August 3rd.

#### **Detective Bureau:**

Patrol Officers arrested a suspect responsible for a burglary at a local hotel earlier in the evening. A lengthy follow-up investigation by detectives implicated the suspect in at least four (4) additional hotel room burglaries in June and July of this year.

#### **Geographical Policing:**

- Field Training Officer (FTO) Alexander Duncan was presented with his 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> 10851 Award Certificate of Recognition for superior effort in vehicle theft recovery by the Automobile Club of Southern California and the California Highway Patrol. From December 4, 2018 to July 7, 2020, FTO Duncan recovered 31 stolen vehicles which resulted in 36 arrests.
- Geographical Policing officers had a monthly meeting with Human Services (along with All Saints Church, the Beverly Hills Homeless Outreach Team, ASBH Media Ministry, Cedars Sinai Medical Center and a representative from Assembly Member Bloom's Office) and discussed the following items: Panhandlers on Canon Drive, messaging against giving money to panhandlers, shelter availability, and chronically homeless individuals.

#### **Traffic Division:**

- During July 2021, our Traffic Bureau issued 11,402 parking citations.
- Parking Citations are up 38% (+30,810) year-to-date.




