

BEVERLY HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT EXECUTIVE SUMMARY MAY 2021

Crime Summary:

During May 2021, we saw a 5% increase in overall crime compared to April 2021. The largest contributing factor was an increase in Aggravated Assaults. Overall, total crime still remains down at -8% year-to-date. We have had 116 less crimes committed thus far in 2021. Our response time to Emergency Calls for Service was lowered to 2.15 minutes and we received 3,134 Community Generated Calls for Service during May 2021.

Community Engagement:

A "Just in Case" ZOOM meeting for the southeast portion of Beverly Hills has been scheduled.

Detective Bureau:

- During May 2021, a residential burglar who was targeting flat screen televisions was being sought by numerous agencies throughout the west side of Los Angeles. On May 2nd, 2021, an alert patrol officer located the suspect vehicle and a vehicle stop was made. The driver was ultimately arrested and after detective follow-up and interviews two Beverly Hills cases were cleared and an additional 30+ cases were cleared throughout the West Los Angeles area.
- On May 11th and May 12th, three suspects associated with an armed robbery and shooting that occurred in the 400 block of N Canon Dr. were arrested and booked into the Los Angeles Federal Detention Center. The three suspects were identified and evidence was presented to the United States Attorney's Office (USAO). The USAO presented the case to the Grand Jury and received an indictment on all three suspects for the robbery and shooting.
- On May 20th, 2021, patrol officers were called to the 200 block of N. Beverly Dr. for a male bleeding in the alley. Detectives were called to the scene and began to investigate. During the same time, BHPD patrol officers were notified by LAPD officers that they had possibly located the suspect involved. The suspect was taken into custody and after a lengthy investigation and interview of the suspect by Detectives he was arrested for attempted murder. The Los Angeles County DA's Office declined to file the case citing "mutual combat."

Geographical Policing:

- On May 3rd, Geographical Policing Officers attended the monthly homeless collaboration meeting with other City and County Departments.
- On May 13th and 19th, the Homeless Liaison Training presented by CPOA was held in the City of Beverly Hills with approximately 40 attendees.
- On May 23rd, Geographical Policing Officers met with leadership from Community Services to discuss the condition of the 4th level parking structure at the Maybourne Hotel.

Traffic Division:

- During May 2021, our Traffic Bureau focused on Distracted Driving Enforcement which led to a +15% increase in speed violation citations.
- We issued 8,761 parking citations.

Crime Category	Sub-Category	Description
ASSAULT	Assault – Aggravated	An assault with a weapon or with the intent to inflict severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assault – Simple	An assault with no intent and not resulting in severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assaults – Prior to Sept 2018	All aggravated and simple assaults (previously combined).
BURGLARY	Burglary – Commercial Building	Entry into a commercial business after business hours with the intent to commit theft
	Burglary – Construction Site	Any entry onto a construction site with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Accessed Garage Only)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a garage (subterranean, attached to residence, detached from residence) with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Home Occupied)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony while the residence is occupied at the time of the crime.
	Burglary – Residential (Common Area)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a common mail area or laundry room of a multi-family residence with the intent to commit mail theft or coin theft.
	Burglary – Residential (No One Home)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony when no one is home at the time of the crime.
DUI ARREST		The arrest of a person for driving while under the influence of any alcoholic beverage or drug.
HOMICIDE		The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT	Motor Vehicle Theft	The theft of a motor vehicle.
ROBBERY	Shoplift Robbery	A shoplifter uses force against store security to retain property stolen from the location.
	Robbery	The taking of anything of value from a person by force or threat of force or violence.
SEX CRIMES		Includes rape, sexual battery and sex registrant violations.
THEFT/LARCENY	Theft – Grand	Theft where the value of the property exceeds \$950, or is taken from a person, or a firearm of any value.
	Theft – Petty	Theft where the value of the property is less than \$950.
	Theft From Commercial Building	Theft (regardless of value) from a commercial business, building or office.
	Theft of Auto Parts	Theft, limited to auto parts, from the interior or exterior of a vehicle.
VANDALISM		The malicious destruction, damage or defacing (graffiti) of real or personal property of another.
VEHICLE BREAK- IN/THEFT	Theft – Grand (From Vehicle)	Entry into a motor vehicle, without force, where the property stolen exceeds \$950.
	Theft – Petty (From Vehicle)	Entry into a motor vehicle, without force, where the property stolen is less than \$950.
	Burglary – From a Motor Vehicle	Forced entry into a locked motor vehicle with the intent to commit theft.
