DESCRIPTION:

Simple American Colonial Revival styling distinguishes this early Beverly Hills home. A side gable roof caps the two story structure, which extends to the south in a one story wing and to the north in a porte cochere. Shuttered six-over-six and three-over-three double-hung sash windows pierce the clapboarded exterior. Located at the approximate center of the facade, the entry is heralded by a portico formed by slender Tuscan columns and an open pediment. Although probably altered over its seventy-year history, the house is representative of the preference for early American styling which characterized many of the city's oldest homes.

B10 Significance:

The remodeling or modification of this building since it was surveyed in 1985-1986 has removed significant architectural details from the primary elevation. These elements include the replacement of the entrance portico with a similar, but wider portico; the removal of second story windows north and south of the entrance; and the addition of a second story to the previously one-story south wing. Additionally, cant bay windows were installed on the ground floor east and west of the entrance, and dormers now appear on the roof. Although the residence is still reflective of the Colonial Revival style, the substantial changes to the mass, scale, materials, and workmanship of the house have significantly affected its architectural integrity. Therefore, due to these substantial changes, the building no longer remains a contributor to the potential historic district defined as the Pre-1920 Residential Thematic Grouping that is eligible for local listing or designation.
