 - New legislation (AB 361) was recently adopted allowing the Beverly Hills City Council Liaison / Legislative/Lobby Committee to continue virtual meetings during the COVID-19 declared emergency subject to certain conditions and the proposed resolution implements the necessary requirements.
 - The resolution was read into the record and the Liaisons unanimously approved the resolution.

2) **2022** Legislative Platform

- The Legislative/Lobby Liaison Committee confirms the following items will remain as the primary legislative focus of the City:
 - Support legislation in regards to local control with community self determination
 - Support legislation which focuses on addressing mental health issues
 - Supporting sustainability in the community including:
 - o Reduce, reuse, recycle:
 - Minimizing food waste; and

- Supporting state funding for the development of solar power, a solar grid, and solar batteries.
- As directed by the Liaisons, staff will make modifications to the Legislative Platform and place it on future City Council agenda for adoption.
