INTRODUCTION

As part of the Business Taskforce, there is a desire for subcommittees to be established to explore different aspects of the impacts of Covid-19 on the business community. The charge of the subcommittees will be to address areas of inquiry as defined by the City Council.

DISCUSSION

The Mayor has suggested areas of inquiry that the subcommittees could explore which are listed below:

- Have there been governmental programs made available to your business that you have been able to utilize in dealing with the Covid-19 crisis?
- Are you aware of programs in other jurisdictions which might be helpful to businesses in Beverly Hills?
- What specific activities can the City of Beverly Hills do to assist your business in the immediate future?
- What specific activities can the City of Beverly Hills do to assist your business as the restrictions are lifted?
- Are there obstacles imposed by the City that you believe will slow your recovery?

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- Are there partners other than the City that you believe will be helpful in the recovery process?
- Are there obstacles from external sources that you believe will be present hindering the recovery process?

Members of the City Council are welcome to suggest additional areas of inquiry. These questions will not be addressed at the Business Taskforce meeting on April 28. They will be addressed by the subcommittees in subsequent meetings.
