CONTINUED BUSINESS

2. Kusama Update

Staff reported to the Commission that the Liaison had considered the possibility to have Ironwood refabricate the piece but the Council Liaisons recommended that the Kusama should be refabricated in Japan. Staff will work on consolidating cost of fabrication in Japan as well as shipping costs to present to the Commission and Liaisons for consideration. Also, following previous direction from the Fine Art Commission, Staff has worked with City Attorney's Office and an extension of the warranty to Ironwood has been extended for one more year.

3. Bove Update

Staff reported that the Liaisons discussed the possibility of deducting the cost of the Bove restoration from the final payment to the Gallery. The Council Liaisons recommended that Staff should reach out to the artist and fabricator, and inquire about the possibility of refinishing the piece in a different material that is more resilient to public interaction. The Commission also discussed options on how to protect the piece.

4. Education Liaison Update

Due to Commissioner Rubins being absent, this ad hoc committee will provide an update on this item at the July meeting.

5. Art Signage

Staff presented to the Commission samples of the "for viewing only" art signage in two different sizes for consideration. The Commission decided to test both size signs, and asked staff to install the big signs by the Tony Smith sculpture and the small ones by the Carol Bove sculpture.

6. Priority Exercise

Staff reported that two proposals of artwork for donation to the City have come forward for the Commission's consideration: one sculpture from artist Mr. Brainwash, and another sculpture from artist Ringo Starr. The Commission requested to include both of these proposals in the July agenda and they selected the rest of items to prioritize and to be included in next month's meeting.
