Rent Stabilization

Community Preservation Office (310) 285-1119

The City has two rent control ordinances as set forth in Chapters 5 and 6, Title 4 of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code. All tenants of apartment units and duplexes fall under one of these two Chapters:

- Tenants whose most recent lease or rent agreement stipulates an initial rent of \$600, or less, per month are Chapter 5
 - The annual allowable Chapter 5 Rent increase for May 2011 is 1%
- Tenants whose most recent lease or rent agreement stipulates an initial rent of \$601, or more, per month are Chapter 6 tenants. The annual Chapter 6 rent increase may not exceed 10%

The City's Community Preservation Office handles rent control complaints, answers inquiries, and provides referrals.

Fair Housing Program

Housing Rights Center 1-(800) 477-5977

The Housing Rights Center (HRC) provides free fair housing services and tenant/landlord counseling to residents, landlords, and property owners. HRC provides investigation of housing discrimination complaints; predatory lending referrals; and legal and advocacy services. Through their landlord/tenant telephone Hot Line, HRC provides legal information on tenant and landlord rights and responsibilities to help resolve housing related issues.

Beverly Hills Senior Housing

225 N. Crescent Drive (310) 475-6083

Provides 151 units of affordable independent living for lower income seniors age 62 and above. With a Whole Foods Market on the ground level, easy elevator access and close proximity to many medical offices, the location is convenient for seniors with limited mobility. Developed and managed by Menorah Housing Foundation.

Handyworker Program

Jewish Family Services (310) 272-7890

The Handyworker Program provides minor home repair, accessibility and security improvements to low income renters and homeowners in both single and multi-family units. The program is administered by Jewish Family Services at no cost to the occupant. Most maintenance issues and home repairs not requiring a permit are eligible, including:

Senior Case Management Program (310) 285-1006

The City contracts with Jewish Family Services to provide case management and ongoing support to elderly residents (age 55+) who need assistance to remain independent in their homes.
