### Consideration of Future Nominations

# Urban Designer Updates

- Urban Designer Mark Odell advised the Commission that staff will soon be meeting with the bronze caster to obtain additional details and specifications on the bronze plaques that are placed throughout the City. Staff expects to receive a prototype of the Golden Shield plaque.
- Staff is working to schedule a meeting with the City Council Liaisons to discuss the Advisory Member Status for retired Cultural Heritage Commissioners, honorary streetnaming opportunities as suggested by the Mayor, and increasing the frequency of Cultural Heritage Commission regular meetings.
- At its meeting on December 17, 2019, the City Council adopted a permanent Mills Act Program.
- Staff is continuing to review the properties at 1033 Woodland Drive, 360 and 375 North Crescent Drive, and 910 North Bedford Drive.
