Police Lieutenant Max Subin, updated the Commission on the following:

- The Beverly Hills police provided a presence when the FBI arrested 3 Beverly Hills residents

Beverly Hills Board of Education member, Dr. Amanda Stern, provided an update on the following:

3. Beverly Hills Homeless Initiative

Enisha Clark, Human Services Specialist, presented the issue of housing and treatment services for the chronic homelessness in the City of Beverly Hills for FY 2020-21. Additionally, Rachel Evans, Clinical Program Coordinator, provided updated advocacy and innovation ideas and policy issues. The Commission was provided suggestions of how they could be of assistance:

- Community Education
- Homeless Advocacy & Innovation such as:
 - Advocate for expanded outreach services by offering additional outreach hours during the early mornings, late nights, and weekend hours;
 - Raise awareness by partnering with regional service providers to observe annual
 - deaths amongst our homeless community through a candlelight vigil or other
 - symbolic gesture;
 - Continue to support our community partners who provide invaluable services to
 - the homeless (i.e. Saban Health Clinic, Step Up on Second, PATH, All Saints, Bet
 - Tzedek, etc.);
 - Advocate for a Department of Mental Health contracted social worker who can

- assist local law enforcement with administering expeditious 51/50 holds and on-
- going case management services;
- Adopt a trauma-informed approach to homeless outreach by law enforcement,
- Human Services, the Homeless Outreach team and other City staff and contractors
- including support for necessary staff trainings; and
- Recommend that the City Council take an innovative approach to homeless
- services and advocate for legislative policy reform on homelessness as part of the
- City's Legislative Platform.

4. Community Assistant Grant Fund (CAGF) RFP

Rachel Evans, Clinical Program Coordinator, updated the Commission on the Community Assistant Grant Fund (CAGF) for 2021 – 2022.

- The application period closes on February 1, 2021 at 5pm
- No applications have been received as of today although several organizations have verbally confirmed that they will be submitting applications.

- Chair Blumenfeld appointed Commissioners Saleh and Sharp to be the Commission liaisons for the CAGF

5. Kindness Task Force

Enisha Clark, Human Services Specialist, provided the results of the Volunteer Survey:

- Of those who responded, 83% had been successful at contacting their match.
- 33% of the volunteers said they were no longer providing services to their matches as the most vulnerable no longer needed their assistance since they had in-home or family help
- Another 33% said their assistance was on an as-needed basis
- Over 90% of the volunteers said their KTF experience was rewarding
- Overall KTF participation has declined over time due to decline in need, pandemic fatigue, and some returning to pre-Covid commitments such as work or school
- Most KTF volunteer matches have naturally dissolved and those still in place will continue to have access to staff support
- If future volunteer assistance is required, KTF Volunteer Lists will be used as a resource
- KTF Volunteers will be formally thanked for their service during Kindness Week.
