Beverly Hills School District – Rachelle Marcus, Board Vice President, and Scott Lovelace,
Director of School Safety, updated the Commission on the after school sports program,

1. Health and Safety Employee Excellence Award

3. Introduction to Potential Health Considerations of 5G Networks

Michael George, Management Analyst, welcomed Dr. Jerrold T. Bushberg for a presentation to the Commission on potential health considerations of 5G networks. The following is the summary of Dr. Bushberg's presentation: With the consensus of other organizations, the FCC (Federal Communications Commission) has regulatory jurisdiction for establishing the radiofrequency (RF) exposure standards for non-ionizing radiation which includes radio waves used in 5G technology. Their decision is guided by the recommendations of the Federal Heal Agencies with the expertise to evaluate the scientific literature of the health and safety of exposure to radio frequency radiation. General summaries indicate that the weak, lowstrength RF signals (non-ionizing) from cell phones and 5G networks, etc. do not have potential adverse health and safety effects, and that this consensus is continually being monitored. The same is true for cell tower sites due to the directional nature of the emissions from the antenna and their distance to people. One's cell phone is typically the highest source of RF exposure. More exposure occurs when the phone is further away from signal towers, causing the phone to utilize more power and transmit and its maximum signal strength. The Commission discussed the standards in the United States vs. other countries, the potential for 5G networks to lower the exposure from cell phones due to the better connection, weighing the need for technological advances and economic incentives vs. potential health effects, whether the technology has been tested before, its effectiveness, and whether it is used in other areas of the world, potential health risks individuals in high rises closer to cell towers, studies done on humans, and the exposure levels of 4G vs. 5G, and the involvement cities have in making their own policies regarding this issue. An informational video was shown.

4. Election 2020

The City of Beverly Hills will be participating in the March 2020 General Municipal Election. There will be 11-days of in person voting up to election day March 3, 2020. There is a new electronic ballot marking system called Voting Solutions for All People (VSAP). It is important to utilize the "MORE" button to view all candidates. Beverly Hills voters can vote for two candidates (maximum). Options to Vote by Mail were also provided. 5. Smoking Update

Michael George, Management Analyst, updated the Commission on Ambassador violation statistics, including dates and locations, Code Enforcement cases, grant funding, 75 smoking banners that have gone up in the City, window decals, the Cedars-Sinai smoking cessation program, mailers, signage around the City, and smoking on construction sites.

6. Liaison Meeting

The Health and Safety Commission Liaison meeting took place on January 27, 2020. Councilmember liaisons Mayor John A. Mirisch and Councilmember Julian A. Gold, M.D. reviewed the 2019 accomplishments and approved the 2020 Health and Safety Commission work plan.
