## 3. Police Department Report

Sergeant Dale Drummond informed the Commission of events within the Police Department:

- The Office of Traffic and Safety (OTS) Grant is being renewed for the coming year.
  Funds are used for overtime related to DUI checkpoints and other traffic enforcement operations.
- There is a DUI Check Point Taking place on North Santa Monica and Crescent Drive at 8:00 PM on September 9<sup>th</sup>.
- The Photo Red Light Enforcement contract with Conduit has been extended an additional 5 years.
- A Police Department training program where officers can work in other Department Bureaus for possible future career enhancement was discussed.

The Commission commented on the Monthly Report and gave feedback about the private security companies contracted by the City.

# 4. Community Development Department Planning Division Quarterly Report

Principal Planner Cindy Gordon provided updates on projects in the City:

- The Dior Project, on the 300 block of North Rodeo Drive Commercial building plans, including an alternative parking facility, will be presented to the Planning Commission on September 8<sup>th</sup>.
- Two other projects are proposed as part of the alternative parking (fully automated parking) are in the review stages.
- Two Electrical Vehicle Dealerships have been established within the City, with a third and fourth to be reviewed by the Planning Commission.
- The Cheval Blanc and ONE Beverly Hills Projects are moving forward.
- The "Saks Project" is in early the review stage.

## 5. Monthly Educational Speaker Series - Carmel, Indiana Roundabout Network

Transportation Planner Jessie Holzer Carpenter introduced Carmel, Indiana's City Engineer Jeremy Kashman, who provided a presentation and overview of Carmel's roundabout system. He discussed the safety, cost and efficiency, plus environmental and aesthetic benefits. The Commission commented.

## 9. Project Update and Follow-up Items

Transportation Planners Jessie Holzer Carpenter and Martha Eros provided updates on projects in the city:

- Grant Funded Pedestrian Crossings; they are out to bid with construction predicted to begin next year.
- Clifton Le Doux Bike Blvd Feasibility Study; Community engagement work plan being developed with consultant, Alta. Community Workshop will be held to create a shared vision for bike boulevard and conduct an audit of the area, looking for existing features to be maintained and/or identifying current issues that should be studied.
- Coldwater Canyon Water Main Replacement; Community meeting will be held on Thursday, September 29<sup>th</sup> from 6:00pm-7:00pm at Coldwater Canyon Park.
- Transit Feasibility Study community was survey released on July 20<sup>th</sup> with 397 survey responses to date. There will be an outreach hybrid meeting on September 8<sup>th</sup> with many other public outreach opportunities future meetings both in person and hybrid for local community groups.
