Chair's Report

- a) Mayor Cabinet's Meeting:
- The Architecture Commission shared that there will be several Rodeo Drive changes, including signage and facade updates and modifications. The Restaurant Sub-Committee approved two new cafes and restaurants, The Parakeet Café and Pop's Bagels.
- The Arts and Culture Commission is celebrating Jewish American Heritage Month in May. In addition, the City will celebrate Pride Month in June.
- The Design Review Commission had a request for a two-story residence at 723 N Bedford Dr. that was approved with conditions, and the second one on 503 N Elm Dr.
- The Health and Safety Commission recognized the BHPD and BHFD for their contributions and the Nurse Practitioner Program. In addition, the Commission reminded all that May is Melanoma Prevention Month. Also, there was a presentation about evacuation boxes throughout the City.
- The Human Relations Commission shared the number for the homelessness initiative 310-285-2468.
- The Planning Commission approved open-door dining for the Parakeet Café. The City Clerk is accepting the upcoming seat on the Commission
- The Public Works Commission proposed an ordinance regarding polystyrene waste and how to regulate it. Also, remind all to continue saving water. May 21 is Public Works Day, which will be celebrated at the Farmers Market.
- The Recreation and Parks Commission had an overview of the Picket ball Pilot Program and is planning the next phase. The Teen Advisory Committee is taking applications for 2023-2024.
- The Rent Stabilization Commission will present a Resolution about past-through costs to tenants.
- The Traffic and Parking Commission had a presentation by Metro regarding their Public Bike Rental Program. May is National Bike Month.

- Discussed the Commissions vacancies.
- Thanked the Charitable Solicitations Commission and the Human Relations Commission for their work on the Community Assistance Grant Fund.
