## **Weekly Water Topic: City Offers Powerful New Conservation Tool**

*Water Tracking System Gives Customers Real-time Information on Water Use*

Beverly Hills, CA – The City's new and improved Water Tracker program makes it easier than ever for customers to keep tabs on their daily, weekly or monthly water consumption. Residential and commercial water customers in Beverly Hills and West Hollywood are urged to register as soon as possible to view their usage online.

The Water Tracker is one of the City's most powerful tools to respond to the State of California's severe four-year drought and state-mandated water reduction goals. Beverly Hills City Council has activated Stage D in the City's emergency water conservation program, which requires Beverly Hills customers to reduce consumption by 30%.

Customers can set up their Water Tracker system to send email alerts when a certain threshold of water use is reached. In addition, it will alert customers if there is continuous flow, which usually means there is a leak somewhere in the system. The City of Beverly Hills is also notified of leaks on individual properties and will continue to notify and assist customers in identifying the leak.
