

Beverly Hills Forum Lecture Series Presents Professor Lee R. Berger, Ph.D. D.Sc.



Beverly Hills, CA – As part of the City of Beverly Hills Forum Series, world-renowned explorer and professor Lee R. Berger, Ph.D. D. Sc. will present "The Astonishing Tale of *Homo naledi*: The Discovery Rewriting the Story of Humankind" on October 16th at 7:30 p.m. at The Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts.

Professor Berger will share the astonishing tales of his explorations into human origins on the African continent, Asia and Micronesia. For the past two and a half decades his work has resulted in many new discoveries, including two new species of early human relatives – *Homo naledi and Australopithecus sediba*. This fascinating program is offered to the public free of charge but advance ticket reservations are required.

Professor Lee R. Berger is an award-winning paleoanthropologist, researcher, explorer, author and speaker. He has been recognized by Time Magazine in 2016 as one of the 100 Most Influential People in the World. He is the recipient of the National Geographic Society's first Prize for Research and Exploration and the Academy of Achievement's Golden Plate Award and was the 2016 National Geographic Society's Rolex Explorer of the Year.
