The Beverly Hills Women's Club played an instrumental role in the civic and cultural development of Beverly Hills. The Club is a one-story building designed in the Spanish Colonial Revival style that has been the site of many of the community's most memorable and significant events. Lawns, mature trees, and lush landscaping surround the building, and a small parking lot occupies the lot to the west. The building features several intact elements of the reserved classical Spanish architectural style inspired by the Italian Renaissance referred to as *estilo desornamentado*. The Club was designed by the notable Los Angeles based architectural firm Gable and Wyant and it serves as an excellent, intact example of an architectural style planners envisioned to create for the refined, yet idyllic ambiance of Beverly Hills.
