HIGHLIGHTS FOR MARCH 2024 ELECTIONS:

- Registered voters can cast ballots at any official Vote Center within Los Angeles County.
- There will be 11 days of voting
 (Saturday, February 24, 2024 -Tuesday, March 5, 2024).
- Voters can also register to vote on Election Day.

VOTING SOLUTIONS FOR ALL PEOPLE (VSAP)

- VSAP electronic ballot marking devices will be available for in-person voting.
- VSAP machines will list four candidates per screen.
- Press the MORE button to see all the candidates listed for the Beverly Hills General Municipal Election.

The Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office has Vote Centers throughout the County. The Beverly Hills Library (Auditorium) will be an 11-Day Vote Center.

Assigned precinct voting will **NOT** take place for the March 2024 election. Instead, Los Angeles County registered voters (inclusive of residents who live in Beverly Hills) may cast their ballots at any designated Vote Center countywide.

- You don't have to vote in every race.

Write-In Candidates



- A voter is entitled to cast a vote for a qualified write-in candidate for any party-nominated, voter-nominated or nonpartisan office by writing, on the write-in portion of the ballot, the name of the qualified candidate.
- To add a candidate, fill in the circle to the left of "Write-In Candidate" and write the name on the dotted line.
- A list of qualified write-in candidates is available eleven days before the election at lavote.gov.
- Do not write-in a candidate whose name already appears on the ballot.

No Party Preference Notification

You are registered to vote with No Party Preference. If you want your ballot to include Presidential candidates you must notify our office. The following parties allow No Party Preference voters to vote in their presidential primaries: American Independent, Democratic, and Libertarian. You may request one of these party's ballots online at LAVOTE.GOV/Crossover or by calling (800) 815-2666, option 2. If you wish to vote for a Presidential candidate in the Green Party, Peace & Freedom Party, or Republican Party you must update your party preference by re-registering to vote. If you are unable to request and receive a partisan ballot in time to return it, you may visit any Vote Center or request a Remote Accessible Vote by Mail ballot at LAVOTE.GOV.





The Human Relations Commission of the City of Beverly Hills strives to promote positive human relations in all aspects of community life.
