Film Screening of Award-Winning Documentary "The Desert of The Forbidden Art"

Filmmaker Amanda Pope to take Questions from Audience

Beverly Hills, Calif. - The Beverly Hills Public Library will hold a free screening of the award-winning documentary, "The Desert of the Forbidden Art", on Sunday, December 4 at 3 p.m. Filmmaker Amanda Pope will take questions from the audience following the screening. The film's run time is 1 hour and 20 minutes. Free parking is available in the lot adjacent to the library located at 444 North Rexford Drive, Beverly Hills.

The "Desert of the Forbidden Art" is about a penniless artist named Igor Savitsky who rescues 40,000 pieces of art during the Soviet rule and creates a museum in the desert of Uzbekistan. After the Soviet Revolution in 1917, Savitsky uncovers a group of artists in Uzbekistan who create original works of art fusing European modernism with centuries-old Eastern traditions.

During her 20-year career, Emmy-winning director Amanda Pope's directing, producing, writing and editing credits include award-winning documentary, dramatic, and social advocacy programs. Her work has focused on the dynamics of creativity in fine art, public art happenings, urban design, theatre and dance. "*The Desert of Forbidden Art*" is Pope's most recent work. Amanda Pope is also a Professor in production of Southern California's School of Cinematic Arts.

"The Desert of Forbidden Art" won the prestigious CINE Golden Eagle Award, which has been widely recognized as a symbol of excellence in professional, independent and student filmmaking for over 50 years.
