9. Water Efficiency Update

Water Conservation Administrator Debby Dunn discussed the current drought situation. The City will remain in the Stage C water conservation restrictions. She relayed water saving tips. The Commission commented on the City's water use; a report will be presented quarterly in the future.

Assistant Director of Public Works/City Engineer Daren Grilley gave an update on Capital Projects including the Robertson Sidewalk Project, Burton Way Median and the Metro Section 2. In addition, there was an update on the Cabrillo Reservoir Project. Water Resources Manager Vince Damasse, with Consultant/Vice President of Kennedy/Jenks David Ferguson, gave a presentation on storage alternatives and the options for smaller reservoirs. Vice Chair Nystrom and Commissioner Greer spoke on behalf of the Ad Hoc meeting held recently on this topic.

The Commission commented and suggested the Cabrillo items be brought back with additional updated information.
